#### 9. New Business

Discussion and possible action to send a letter to CD 5 and CD10 (and maybe all CD's and the Mayor) to open a council file to explore drone-as-a-first-responder programs that allow LAPD to utilize drones to combat crime. In addition, request that the CD's supply the LAPD with financial assistance to install and utilize ALPRs and CCTV cameras similar to the system used in the city of Beverly Hills. Drones and use of ALPR and CCTV cameras would boost the LAPD's ability to do their job and increase public safety. Background: Since 2019 the LAPD has lost thousands of officers. Recruitment is down. We currently have 8800 sworn LAPD officers, far below Mayor Karen Bass' goal of 9,500 and about 300 below what the current budget allows, roughly 9,300 officers. In 2019, the LAPD had 10,008 sworn officers. Drones and use of ALPR and CCTV cameras would boost the LAPD's ability to do their job and increase public safety.
- b. Discussion and possible action to send a letter to CD 10 requesting No Parking at Any Time signs be installed in the Garth Underpass under the 10 Freeway on both sides of the street from Corning to Beverlywood.
- c. Discussion and possible action to create a special account for brighter street lights in the SORO area. Each location is \$1000 per light and the SORO NC Public Safety Committee would focus on 10 locations for \$10,000.00. SORO NS PS committee to work with LAPD to determine the location to decrease crime.
- d. Discussion and possible action to address safety issues in the community from stop signs to crosswalks and any other safety issues.
